## WHY TAKE A RED BUS TOUR

GUESTS VISITING GLACIER NATIONAL PARK OFTEN ASK THE QUESTION, “WHY SHOULD I TAKE A TOUR ON A RED BUS?”

Red Buses are by no means the only way to get across the Going-to-the-Sun Road, with other options being, but not limited to, personal cars, a transit system, biking and even hiking. However, the Red Bus is a unique touring experience with numerous advantages for not only you, but also in helping to preserve this beautiful place for future generations.

The Going-to-the-Sun Road is both beautiful and awe-inspiring, with majestic mountains and the accompanying hairpin curves over steep cliffs. It is a road which should be seen and appreciated by everyone. However, with the drivers attention placed firmly on the road, as it should be, they miss most of the enjoyment. Our staff of well-trained and highly informative “Jammers” are here to let you sit back and enjoy the road the way it should be enjoyed while they do the driving for you. We are also here to inform and entertain, as you will hear stories on everything from history, geology, and flora to fauna.

In addition to your personal enjoyment, the Red Buses also play an important role in helping to preserve the park. By leaving your car in the parking lot and riding with us, you help to reduce the amount of emissions being put in the park. And since our Buses run mostly on clean burning propane, it significantly helps to keep our cherished glacier air as pure as possible.



## 75 YEARS OF TOURING EXPERIENCE 1936-2011

For 75 years, Glacier National Park’s fleet of 33 Red Buses have been providing visitors unparalleled experiences touring through one of the most spectacular parks anywhere, and they have done it with the elegance and grace that has become synonymous with these unique vehicles. Considered by many to be the oldest fleet of touring vehicles anywhere, the Red Buses are as much a part of Glacier National Park as the mountains they drive up and the wildlife which inhabit the park.

The drivers of the Red Buses are called “Jammers” by the locals; a name which carries over from the days when the Buses had standard transmissions and the drivers could be heard “jamming” the gears as they drove up and down the rugged mountain highway. The Jammer’s sharp eyes are also trained to point out Glacier’s wildlife treasures, including grizzly and black bears, mountain goats and big horn sheep.

Built by the White Motor Company of Cleveland, Ohio between 1936 and 1939, the Model 706 Buses were the third generation of Buses to be used for touring in the park. Some say it was the opening of the Going-to-the-Sun Road which helped to ensure the Buses continual use. Regardless, over the last 75 years, the Buses have proved their worthiness and continue to do so every year. And with the help of Ford Motor Company’s restoration in 2001, we anticipate another 75 years of providing our guests with the best possible touring experience.



## EARLY SPRING AND LATE FALL TOURS

While the alpine section of the Going-to-the-Sun Road may not be accessible, Glacier National Park is, and early spring and late fall are truly some of the best times to visit. The crowds have diminished, the wildlife is active, and you will feel a more personal connection with this remarkable park.

In the spring, waterfalls and wildflowers begin to cover the landscape with a profusion that is only enhanced by the snowy remnants of a harsh winter. The crisp clean glacier air fills your lungs with the anticipation of what is about to come.

In autumn, after a busy season of entertaining tourists from around the world, Glacier National Park begins the transition into its winter slumber. The aspens, cottonwoods, and mountain ash, which sprinkle the mountainsides, are known for their brilliant red, yellow, and gold colors. It is also the best time to appreciate the serenity of autumn in Glacier.

Your journey over the 10,000-year-old Old North Trail consists of the three valleys along the eastern edge of Glacier National Park. On this 8-hour tour, you will discover the quiet grandeur of the Two Medicine Valley, the majestic peaks of the St. Mary Valley, including the Wild Goose Island overlook, and complete the trip with an awe-inspiring ride into the Swiftcurrent Valley. Expect to have your breath taken away by the sights you will encounter as well as an excellent opportunity to see three of the remaining glaciers in the park. An optional lunch along the way is not included but there will be time.

Your journey begins in the glacially clad Swiftcurrent Valley and continues on through St. Mary and over the Hudson Bay Divide on the 10,000-year-old Old North Trail. Traverse through pristine mountain and prairie vistas on your way to an optional lunch at the historic Glacier Park Lodge Great Northern Dining Room. After lunch, experience Glacier's "secret" Two Medicine Valley with a short optional stroll to Running Eagle Falls and a stop at the historic Two Medicine Campstore. Return to Many Glacier Valley after a short stop at the picturesque Wild Goose Island overlook on Going-to-the-Sun Road.

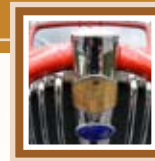

# EAST SIDE SHUTTLE

Glacier Park, Inc. offers shuttle service to many locations along the East side of Glacier National Park. Shuttles are white, eight passenger vans and seating is on a space-available basis. This East Side Shuttle begins operation on June 3, 2011 with its last run on September 25, 2011.

To determine your shuttle departure time and location, refer to the grid below and start on the left with the red column showing where you are originating. Then, move right along the row to the column that displays your destination (destinations can be found in the top red row). The box where this column and row intersect will be your departure time and total price per person for this one-way shuttle. Arrival times are not listed. Children age 11 and under are half price.

\* A shuttle between St. Mary's Visitors Center and Many Glacier Hotel may be offered for a fee from July 1, 2011 to September 2, 2011 in order to connect in St. Mary with the NPS transit system.

\*\* The shuttle will not operate between Chief Mountain Border Crossing and the Prince of Wales Hotel after September 19, 2011.

\*\*\*The Cut Bank Creek area trailheads and campgrounds are approximately 5 miles from the drop off on Highway 89. Visitors getting off here will have a significant hike to the campgrounds.

# BELTON TRAIN STATION SHUTTLE

This shuttle provides passenger and luggage transportation between the West Glacier Train Station and both the Lake McDonald Lodge and the Village Inn at Apgar. This shuttle does not stop at any campgrounds, although many are within walking distance of the two stops.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

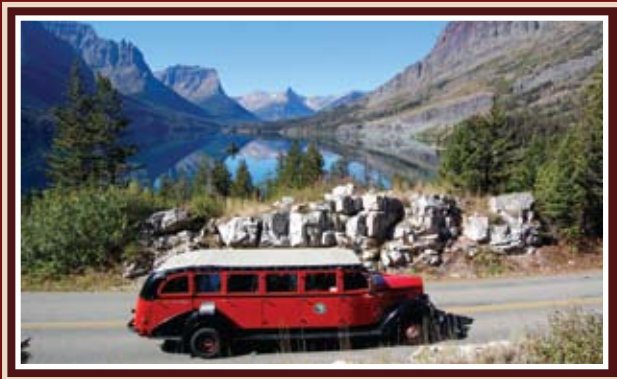
### Why can't I hike to Waterton and take a shuttle back?

You can, but because Glacier Park, Inc. is not allowed to provide one way trips into or out of Canada, you must take a separate Waterton shuttle to the border, walk across and then we can pick you up on the American side at 3:45 pm. However, we are allowed to bring you back across the border if we brought you up there to begin with.

### PLEASE NOTE

Prices for all tours (except where noted) are for transportation only. All rates are quoted in U.S. dollars and do not include driver gratuity. Child prices are for children age 11 and under. Children must have an accompanying adult. Tour prices, dates, and times may change at any time without notice and without a reprinting of this brochure.

Tour routes and itineraries scheduled to go over the Going-to-the-Sun Road are dependent upon access to Logan Pass Visitor Center due to visibility, snow or rock fall, and other construction projects underway by the National Park Service. Construction delays may occur at any point along the tour and may cause tour timing and itinerary modification. Views of the Park while on a tour are weather dependent.

Glacier National Park and Waterton Lakes National Park have separate entrance fees not included in tour pricing. If you are already inside the Park, please bring your Park entrance fee receipt as most tours exit and re-enter the Park. Please be at the tour departure location a minimum of ten minutes prior to tour departure time.

### CANCELLATION POLICY

Deposits are fully refundable for 30 days following the date the tour reservation was made. From 31 days after the reservation was made to 3 days prior to tour departure, the deposit will be refunded less a \$15.00 administrative fee per tour. Cancellations made within 3 days of tour departure will result in a full forfeit of the deposit. For reservations made within 30 days prior to tour departure, the above policy applies with no 30-day grace period.

### CANADIAN TRAVEL

As of the printing of this brochure, US Customs and Immigrations state that, a Passport, Passport Card, or Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI) compliant document will be required of all travelers, including children, re-entering the United States from a foreign country. Single parents must have proof of custody of their children. Special restrictions exist on crossing the border with defensive sprays, alcohol, tobacco, and some purchases. All firearms and weapons must be declared. For specific requirements on crossing the border from the United States into Canada, telephone (403) 653-3009. For information crossing from Canada into the United States, telephone (406) 732-5572.

### ADA TOURS

The historic Red Buses, operated by Glacier Park, Inc., are not Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessible and do not have a wheelchair ramp or lift installed, nor do they have space designated for wheelchair use or the accompanying lock downs.

Why is this? When the rehabilitation was started on the Red Buses in 2001, an analysis was conducted to determine if the bodies could be modified to accommodate wheelchairs. Engineering analysis showed that the modifications that would have been made to the historic bodies of the vehicles were such that the structural stability and safety would have been compromised to an unacceptable level thereby making them unsafe as tour vehicles.

GPI has a handicapped accessible van that is equipped with wheelchair lifts and wheelchair lock down capabilities for several wheelchairs. GPI will offer a complete and narrated tour in the van as an alternative. Advance notice makes this option more readily available, but it can be arranged with some small lead-time.
